Tribal Henna Application ~

There are as many ways of drawing tribal designs as there are artists drawing them. Every tool has different capabilities and different limitations. Described below is one method for creating tribal henna body adornment.

Tools: Fine tipped jaquard bottle Toothpick Henna paste

The henna should be well sifted and mixed to a fluid paste.

Choose a design.

This simple tribal motif is called Djin



The following illustrations show the stages of drawing involved in tribal henna application.

2. Construction lines. These lines should define the main shape. The solid line represents the first henna 'guide' lines, the broken line shows the final shape.



3. Complete the outline of the shape.



You may end up with something rather untidy as above.

4. Fill.

To avoid uneven staining it is important to keep the depth of henna paste constant across the design. This can be achieved by using the same bottle tip used for drawing. Move it across the design from side to side between the outer lines.



5. Finishing and Florishing ~

The best way to get good clean points on your designs is to get the first line in the right place. By drawing fast as you lift your hand the henna will naturally thin to a sharp point.



Another way to achieve a sharp point is to apply the henna approximately in the right shape and drag it using a toothpick into the right shape.

There is a number of different ways to finish a line:

a) Sharp



The easiest way to form a sharp point on the inside of a scroll is to scrape henna out with a toothpick.

b) Inverted sharp



By finishing the inside of the scroll with a ball you can create a sharp finish in the negative space.

c) Rounded



A natural rounded soft ending. Henna will naturally tend to settle into this type of shape unless you intervene.

d) Brush flourish



This type of line ending simulates the mark made by a brush in some types of brush-drawn calligraphy.
